The Green Bay School District is **NOW** accepting applications for **PRESCHOOL** for the 2017-2018 school year. *Will your child be 3 or 4 prior to September 1st?* Do you have a family member or neighbor who has a child who will be 3 or 4 prior to September 1st? Apply at your neighborhood elementary school or at the Head Start Learning Center during school hours or at the school district's Central Registration department at 200 South Broadway.

For current Head Start parents of 3 year old children – You will be notified by Head Start about your child returning to Head Start OR going to 4K for the 2017-2018 school year.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Teachers are in the process of setting up a time to meet with you regarding your child's progress in Head Start/4k. If you are unable to meet with your child's teacher at the scheduled time, please call to reschedule. Most conferences will take place on February 21, in the evening, and all day and evening on March 2. There will be no school on March 2.

- Arrive on time.
- Think of yourself and your child's teacher as a team whose shared goal is to help make your child's preschool experience a happy and productive one.
- Let your child's teacher know if you have questions.
- Keep the attention focused on your child.
- Be open to suggestions from the teacher.
- Try to be positive! The better your child feels about herself/himself, the better she/he will do in school!
- Before leaving, make sure you are clear about what you can do to encourage success for your child.

SCIENCE IS FUN

Penguins like to slide on ice. Let's try our own experiment to see which toys slide on ice and which don't. Here's what you need: a shallow pan, water, and 5 (more or less) items to test. Also a pen and paper to make a table showing results.

- 1. Add water to a shallow pan and then let it freeze (just stick it outside overnight)
- 2. Make a recording sheet on paper. Will the toys slide or not.
- 3. Put a bowl underneath the pan to create a small angle.
- 4. Let your little one start testing out their objects. Have them make a prediction

February is Dental Health Month

YOU can prevent dental disease. Remember "2x2". Kids and adults should be brushing 2 times per day for 2 minutes each time. Make brushing fun by trying this:

- Race to the bathroom
- Hunt for leftover dinner in the teeth
- Count the teeth
- Make faces.
- Ask your child to sing you the brushing song from school. Make up a new song together
- Remind your child, that teacher will be glad you brushed
- End with hugs and tickles.

Remember to help your child brush correctly. Brush your teeth and tongue at the same time every day. Make brushing part of your daily routine. Use a little bit of fluoride toothpaste that they like and use a soft toothbrush.
